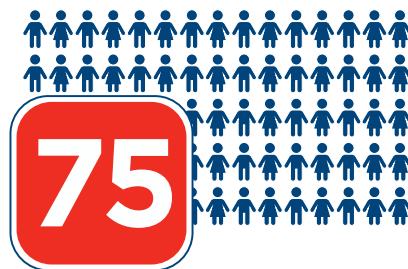
One year of CASA advocacy costs less than one month of foster care.

A child with a CASA volunteer is half as likely to re-enter the foster-care system.
