| Transitional Living Housing (18 to 21) Must have High School Diploma or GED and Employment | Not Eligible |
| Food (Foster Care Per diem) | Emergency Short Term Assistance (90 Days) |
| Clothing (Foster Care Per diem) | Emergency Short Term Assistance |
| Transportation (MARTA Cards. See your Case manager) | Emergency Short Term Assistance |

| Medical Health Insurance (Medicaid) | -You MUST apply for your own health insurance (Chafee Medicaid*) -Kaiser Bridge Program (for former foster youth)* - Emergency support available through ILP.* |
